It's time again to license your dogs and cats. 2019 licenses can be purchased from the city clerk (\$5.00 for dogs, \$3.00 for cats) and are good for one year (Jan. 1 to Dec.31). Proof of vaccinations is required to get your license.

Snow Removal Rules Reminder

Whenever we get 2" of snow or more, the city automatically calls a "Snow Emergency" and NO motor vehicle may be parked on the streets of Onamia until the snow is plowed. Your vehicle will be ticketed and towed at your expense. Please remind any house guests or tenants of these rules. Thanks!

Recycling and Snow Plowing

We normally do not think of recycling and snow plowing at the same time. However, this past Monday, these two things collided. Mother Nature dumped enough snow on Sunday evening and overnight to initiate a "Snow Emergency" and many of you put out your recycles for Monday pickup as usual. As some of the recycle bins were set out BEFORE we plowed the streets, those bins were pushed over or covered over when the plows came by.

We are asking that if it is snowing on Sunday evening please do not put your recycle bin out until **after** we have plowed on Monday morning. This should hopefully prevent any further collisions. Thank you.

Fire Hydrants and Snow

As long as we are on the subject of snow, if there is a fire hydrant in or near your yard, please shovel or blow the snow away from the fire hydrant. Our Fire Departments needs quick access to the hydrant. The house they save may be yours.

Speed Limits in the City

There has been some concern voiced about the excessive speeds driven by some drivers in the city. We have also had a request to put up more stop signs to help reduce the speed. MN statute allows cities to adopt and post slower limits. Before doing either, the City Council would like to remind you that the Maximum speed limit is 30mph on city streets and 10 mph on alleys. However, some of our streets are rather narrow and a slower speed is safer for everyone. Please pay attention to the condition of the street and the people around you when driving around town.
