



### **Pet License**

It's time again to license your dogs and cats. 2018 licenses can be purchased from the city clerk (\$5.00 for dogs, \$3.00 for cats) and are good for one year (Jan. 1 to Dec.31). Proof of vaccinations is required to get your license.

### **Fire Hydrants and Snow**

If there is a fire hydrant in or near your yard, please shovel or blow the snow away from the fire hydrant. Our Fire Departments needs quick access to the hydrant. The house they save may be yours.

### **City-wide Clean Up**

### **Crosswalks and Yellow Curbs**

It has come to the attention of the council that cars are being parked in the crosswalks and along yellow painted curbs and on corners. This is especially happening around the Post Office.

Crosswalks are there for the safety of pedestrians. Cars should **never** be parked in crosswalks even when dropping off a passenger. Cars should **never** park along yellow painted curbs or on a corner, even for a minute!! Corners are painted yellow so drivers have better visibility at intersections when turning. The Police Department has been directed to remind drivers of these rules. Let's keep our streets, intersections and crosswalks safe for all of us.
