Election Day is Tues. Nov. 6<sup>th</sup>. Polls will be open from 7 am to 8 pm at City Hall. Two city council positions and the mayor's office are on the ballot along with other local, county, state and federal offices. Be sure to bring proper ID with you as we have a computerized system that requires it. Make your voice heard, vote!!

### Fall Clean Up

When you rake and clean your yard, bagged leaves and bundled branches/sticks can be placed at the curb for pickup by the city workers. Please **remove the trash and garbage** before bagging the leaves.

If you dump your leaves and branches at the city dump site, please **remove any trash or garbage** before dumping it. Take your leaf bags home with you. This dumpsite is for leaves and branches only! Do not leave automobile tires or other household trash.

### Snow Removal Rules

The snow will be here before we want it, so here are the Snow Removal/Plowing Rules. Whenever we get 2" of snow or more, the city automatically calls a "Snow Emergency" and NO motor vehicle may be parked on the streets of Onamia until the snow is plowed. Your vehicle will be ticketed and towed at your expense. Start planning now to avoid this unwanted expense. Please remind any house guests or tenants of these rules. Thanks!
