Snow Removal Rules

Usually this time of year we say "the snow will be here soon". However, it has already come! So, here is a reminder of the Snow Removal/Plowing Rules. Whenever we get 2" of snow or more, the city automatically calls a "Snow Emergency" and NO motor vehicle may be parked on the streets of Onamia until the snow is plowed. Your vehicle will be ticketed and towed at your expense. Start planning now to avoid this unwanted expense. Please remind any house guests or tenants of these rules.

Also, if the forecast is for 2 or more inches of snow, please wait to put your Garbage (Wednesdays) or recycling(Tuesday) out until after the street is plowed.

When taking care of the snow in your yard, it is NEVER appropriate to shovel or blow your snow in the street! Thanks!
