

## Spring Clean Up

Spring is slowly coming. Let the clean-up begin!! City Maintenance will be doing some street sweeping in May. Please watch for them and move your vehicle off the street until your street is done. Thanks

When you rake and clean your yard, bagged leaves and small, bundled branches/sticks can be placed at the curb for pickup by the city workers. Please **remove the trash and garbage** before bagging the leaves. Grass clippings and leaves can be left in the fenced area to the west of the creamery building. Branches and brush can be hauled to the city dump site located 1.5 miles west of Onamia. Remember to **remove any trash or garbage** before dumping it.

Auto tires, construction or demolition debris, old wood furniture IS NOT to be dumped at the city dump site. If you have questions about what to dump, call the city shop/maintenance dept.


## Onamia Depot Library

## Pet Reminder

Just a couple reminders: 1) 2023 licenses for cats and dogs can be purchased at city hall (\$5.00 for dogs, \$3.00 for cats) and are good for one year (Jan. 1 to Dec.31). Proof of vaccinations is required to get your license. There is a Vaccination Clinic scheduled for Saturday, May 6 at the Malmo

Community Center from 9am to 1pm See below for more details.

Pets running loose may be impounded, resulting in fines, impound fees and boarding costs.
